Sandro Calvani, Dhebora Mirabelli and Lilly Ippoliti, published by the publishing house Ave in 2018, returns to readers authentic stories of lives and businesses of forty-two people of different origins, out of the routine a boring everyday life that testifies with their personal history how they managed to achieve happiness and change their world.

Is not the achievement of happiness the greatest conquest of all time?

Here, thanks to the example of people like Abela, Aditi and Abhay, Alessandro, Apoe, Cecilia, Cesar, Diego, Jean Paul and Maggy, just to name a few, the heroes of

our time are dressed in humanity and courage and change things . Mind you,

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these heroes do not leave the happiness to the poets, philosophers and thinkers, they roll up their hands and touch the bottom, climb the mountains without stopping to climb to the top. Where we all are victims of discouragement, fear and laziness, we dream of arriving while we admire and envy them with our noses.
